Fire Celebration

DORSTEN. Was he the "only person who wanted to enter Parliament with honest intentions"? Guy Fawkes and his failed assassination were celebrated by the Dorsten twinning association on Saturday "Bonfire Night".

Guy Fawkes - The only person to enter Parliament with honest intentions. "Typically British humour". This was also a statement on poster for the Bonfire Night organised by the Dorsten twinning association. On Saturday, they met in the Wacholderhauschen to celebrate a British tradition in Germany.

On the 5th of November each year, the British Kingdom commemorates a historic event from the early 17th century, known as "Bonfire Night". It refers to the failure of the so-called "Gunpowder Plot" of 5 November 1605, in which a group of Catholic conspirators tried to blow up the Houses of Parliament. Thirty-six barrels of gunpowder were to kill the deputy and then Protestant King James I. at London's Westminster Palace.

The most famous figure and at the same time main organiser of the attack was an explosives expert Guy Fawkes. But he was caught red-handed and the assassination could be thwarted. He and his accomplices were sentenced to death.

Even nowadays Britain celebrates the failure of the conspiracy with lots of fireworks. There are street parades and in the evening, burning of Guy Fawkes effigy and fireworks is the highlight of the evening.

In Wacholderhauschen too Guy Fawkes was played by Dorsten twinning association committee member Mr Peter Günther, who was equally caught and convicted. "However in the end we burned effigy instead of Peter", said the Association Chair Marita Kipinski, grinning: "We do not have enough executive committee members so that we can burn one each year." The British black humour has arrived in Germany.

Since 2004, the Dorsten twinning association always celebrates the "Bonfire Night" in Dorsten. On Saturday, 56 registered guests, including Mayor Tobias Stockhoff and "Bishop" Philip Ralph originally from Crawley were present - which means that this year we had more people attending than in any other previous year. The evening started with a small play about the arrest of Guy Fawkes. But instead of fireworks, as is the custom in England, the children lit some sparklers, while the Guy Fawkes effigy was burning.

The ceremony was followed with a typical German dinner: potato salad, sausages and "Frikadellen" (meatballs.). English afters in the form of Crips and Parkin Cake were also served.

Feier am Feuer

DORSTEN. War er die "einzige Person, die das Parlament mit ehrlichen Absichten betreten wollte"? Guy Fawkes und sein gescheitertes Attentat feierte der Freundeskreis Crawley am Samstag bei der "Bonfire Night".

So auch dieses Statement auf einem Plakat bei der Bonfire Night des Freundeskreises Crawley. Am Samstag traf man sich im Wacholderhäuschen um eine britische Tradition auch in Deutschland zu feiern.

Am 5. November jedes Jahres gedenkt man im britischen Königreich einem historischen Ereignis aus dem frühen 17. Jahrhundert, das unter dem Namen "Bonfire Night" bekannt geworden ist. Es bezieht sich auf das Scheitern des sogenannten "Gunpowder Plot" (deutsch: Schießpulver-Verschwörung) vom 5. November 1605, bei dem eine Gruppe katholischer Verschwörer versuchte die Houses of Parliament in die Luft zu sprengen. 36 Fässer mit Schießpulver sollten den Abgeordneten und dem damaligen protestantischen König Jakob I. im Londoner Westminster-Palast den Garaus machen.

Die bekannteste Figur und zugleich ausführendes Organ des Anschlags war der Sprengstoffexperte Guy Fawkes. Aber er wurde auf frischer Tat ertappt und das Attentat konnte vereitelt werden. Er und seine Mittäter wurden zum Tode verurteilt.

Noch heute feiert Großbritannien das Scheitern des Komplotts mit jeder Menge Böllern und Getöse. Es gibt Straßenumzüge und am Abend ist das Verbrennen einer Guy Fawkes-Puppe mit anschließendem Feuerwerk Höhepunkt der Veranstaltungen.

Auch im Wacholderhäuschen wurde Guy Fawkes, gespielt von Peter Günther aus dem Vorstand des Freundeskreises, gefasst und verurteilt. "Anschließend verbrennen wir aber statt ihm eine Puppe auf dem Scheiterhaufen", so Vorsitzende Marita Kipinski grinsend: "Wir haben nicht genug Vorstandsmitglieder, um jedes Jahr einen zu verbrennen." Der britische, schwarze Humor ist in Deutschland angekommen.

Seit 2004 feiert der Freundeskreis Crawley die "Bonfire Night" in Dorsten. Am Samstag waren 56 angemeldete Gäste, darunter Bürgermeister Tobias Stockhoff und Bischof Philip Ralph aus Crawley, dabei – mehr als in den Jahren zuvor. Der Abend begann mit einem kleinen Schauspiel über die Verhaftung von Guy Fawkes. Anstelle von Böllern, wie in England, entzündeten die Kinder Wunderkerzen, während die Guy Fawkes-Puppe brannte.

Dann gab es typisch deutsches Abendessen: Kartoffelsalat, Würstchen und Frikadellen. Kombiniert mit englischer Nachspeise in Form von Crips und Parkin Cake.
